3	CHAIR THOMPSON: Okay. Good		
4	morning, everybody. This is Gary Thompson,		
5	Chair of the Board of Elections. And with me		
6	is Mike Gill, also Board member, so we've		
7	established a quorum. I guess my first motion		
8	would be to go out of executive session and		
9	come back on the public record.		
10	MEMBER GILL: Second.		
11	CHAIR THOMPSON: Okay. All in favor		
12	of that?		
13	MEMBER GILL: Aye.		
14	CHAIR THOMPSON: So the ayes carry.		
15	(WHEREUPON THE PROCEEDING WAS		
16	CONTINUED BRIEFLY WHILE THE BOARD CONVENED IN		
17	EXECUTIVE SESSION)		
18	CHAIR THOMPSON: We're back on the		
19	record. I see we have several participants. I		
20	see a couple of phone numbers. I'm assuming		
21	one of those phone numbers is Ms. Henderson, at		
22	least I'm hoping it is.		

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1 MS. HENDERSON: Good morning. I'm 2 present. 3 CHAIR THOMPSON: Okay. Thank you so 4 much. Yes, we've noticed the time for this, 5 and it sounds like my connection is working. Ι little 6 apologize. It's а choppy. As Ι 7 mentioned in our last hearing, I'm now down in 8 Fort Myers, Florida helping my sister bail out 9 from pretty severe hurricane damage. The streets down here are just lined with debris. 10 11 If you can imagine just dozens of blocks, I 12 don't know, they go on for miles of people who have just put all of their earthly possessions 13 at the curbside and their homes flooded half a 14 story up. A lot of banging in drywall and 15 16 dehumidifiers running. It puts everything into 17 perspective. 18 But, anyway, but I'm glad I could

18 But, anyway, but I'm glad I could 19 connect, and I did through the miracle of 20 technology. I could read everything. I read 21 the emails, I read the supplemental submission 22 by, the Office of Campaign Finance put some

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emails into the record. And I certainly read
 Ms. Henderson's surrebuttal statement following
 our last hearing.

We talked about it in the executive 4 5 session, and my motion at this time is to adopt the findings of the Office of Campaign Finance 6 7 reflected in their second amended order, as 8 namely to uphold the fine, the reduced fine of 9 \$550. Is there a second? 10 MEMBER GILL: Second.

11 CHAIR THOMPSON: And before I call 12 for the vote, I'll just add a couple of 13 comments. I guess what influenced me is the 14 evidence that the training that was conducted for all candidates in the program, the Fair 15 Election 16 Program, undoubtedly covered the 17 importance of filing requirements, including 18 the March 10th date. There were two email 19 reminders that were sent to the emails that 20 were certified by each candidate in the system, 21 including Ms. Henderson, so I don't see any 22 dispute that notices were sent, in addition to

that being covered at the training and in addition to other materials that indicated the importance of those filing requirements.

4 For me, this is important because 5 we're talking about the Fair Election Program. I mean, they're important in the context of the 6 7 traditional program, of course, where there's 8 private funding involved, but this is public 9 taxpayer money and it's important that these requirements be observed for the purpose of 10 11 reporting and ultimately auditing the use of 12 taxpayer funds.

I'm also influenced by the former delinquency in filing reports previous in the traditional program. I think six different filings, fifteen violations, six fines, and five of them were --

19 CHAIR THOMPSON: -- only one that 20 was imposed. So I find that to be relevant to 21 weighing on whether a fine should be imposed 22 here. And, of course, I, you know, as the

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record reflects, the fine, at least on a per 1 2 diem basis, is \$1,100 and I was glad to see it reduced to \$550. I think that was just and 3 fair under the circumstances. 4 5 But that's my thinking as to why I made the motion, although I listened carefully 6 7 to certainly all the points that were made as 8 to why it was, in Ms. Henderson's view, 9 inequitable to impose fine this а at time. But, nevertheless, I'm persuaded that the OCF 10 11 did the right thing. 12 Mike, any comments from you before 13 we call the vote? 14 MEMBER GILL: So I'm going to vote in favor of the motion, and my rationale is 15 16 similar to yours. You know, it's important 17 that, you know, there's no question as to 18 whether these reports were filed timely or not. 19 They weren't. There were some questions as to 20 whether there was a courtesy heads-up given. 21 The emails that I've seen show that, clearly, 22 OCF did its part to put these out. Now, I

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don't know if we can ever -- we can't decide if
 technology works and these didn't get there,
 but they definitely went out.

4 And the fact that, you know, OCF, in 5 their judgment, reduced the fine, I don't think should then second-guess, you know, 6 we the 7 fines that are in the statutes that are decided 8 by the counsel. Those aren't our numbers. You 9 know, I've, in the past, talked about whether they're sometimes too high or not. 10 But the 11 fact is this was important to the Council the way they set this up, it's important that these 12 13 reports be field. And, you know, I don't want 14 to second-guess the OCF's judgment in making the reduction. But the fact is it does sit out 15 important that people make 16 there as these 17 reports in a timely manner.

18 CHAIR THOMPSON: Yes, thank you for 19 that. And also it's not personal. There has 20 been and there will be consistency among all 21 candidates who participate in the program in 22 this regard. There were several ad hominem

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1 points that were made about, you know, 2 conspiracy and collusion and that kind of Those are all just ad hominem beside 3 thing. 4 the point. We're just looking at just the 5 facts here and trying to do what's right for 6 the OCF and all the program and for the 7 candidates. 8 So I guess, with that, I'll call the 9 All in favor of this motion? Ave. vote. 10 MEMBER GILL: Aye. So it carries two 11 CHAIR THOMPSON: 12 to nothing. know, Ms. Henderson, Ι you're 13 disappointed, maybe more than disappointed. 14 And I certainly respect your right to appeal 15 I expect that you will, and that's fine. this. 16 That's certainly your prerogative. 17 So with that, we've already heard 18 from everybody. I think, with that, we've 19 concluded our handling of this, and I would 20 move that we adjourn. 21 MEMBER GILL: Second. 22 CHAIR THOMPSON: All in favor.
